Sniper Murders Brother In A Crossfire

In the city of Dublin, Ireland an undercover Republican sniper shot and killed two enemies, one being his own brother. Both of the lives were lost about one in the morning. The sniper wouldn't of lost his brother if the war had just ended when it was supposed to end.

The gun shots started at about ten pm and continued throughout the night. It is still unknown to what started the gun shots. One of the neighbours had a visual on the incident and Harry Green said, "There was lots of gunfire coming from the top of houses. Then in the middle of it all there was a big break where there was no gun shots." We know that one of the enemy's had been shot by a sniper and the other by a revolver.

Down the street in one of the houses was Mary Baker and she said, "I saw a big armored truck with a turret on the top of it, speeding down the street." When we got to the scene there was no proof of that turret truck going through there, but it was more than just Mary that had saw it.

We also believe that the sniper had been hit in the crossfire but we have no report of injury but we found traces of blood at the scene.
